**Re: Trinity Washington University Campus Plan Application**

Dear Chairman Hood and Zoning Commissioners:

**LET IT BE KNOWN** that Advisory Neighborhood Commission 5E, at its December 20, 2016, duly noticed Public Monthly Meeting, held at Friendship-Armstrong Public Charter School voted to support Trinity University Campus Plan of 2017 -2027.

The 2017-2027 Trinity Campus Plan will benefit our community and the District of Columbia. The Campus Plan largely continues the operations of Trinity in an unchanged manner, while modernizing some facilities, potentially replacing outdated residence halls, and leaving open the possibility of partnering with a developer to provide housing on campus. These aspects of the Campus Plan were included in the 2006 Campus Plan, and the ANC remains supportive of those objectives.

The 2017-2027 Trinity Campus Plan continues the ongoing, positive operations the university has on the surrounding community. The continued education of DC residents, especially through Trinity's many school programs, provides a positive impact on the community. Further, the fact that the Campus Plan does not anticipate significant growth, construction, or actions that impede on the existing surrounding neighborhood assures the ANC that the Campus Plan will not have an adverse impact on the neighborhood.


Finally, the ANC's support is reflective of the fact that Trinity has been a good neighbor to the ANC 5E community. Trinity in the past has allowed the community to visit and use its facilities for community events. Additionally, Trinity provides membership to the Trinity Center for fitness use at a discounted rate for Brookland residents. Trinity is also instituting a Community Library Patron program for neighborhood residents.

For all of these reasons, the ANC is in support of the 2017 Campus Plan. Thank you for giving great weight to the recommendations of ANC 5E, and we hope that you will promptly approve the Trinity application.


