The mission of the Mayor's Special Events Task Group Division is to provide outstanding support of the city's public safety planning efforts for events requiring interagency coordination and to provide the highest quality interagency reviews and assessments of the operational, public safety and logistical components of proposals for special events. The 2017 Rock n Roll Marathon Series participant range is 20K; the District of Columbia resident participation is 25%; and spectator range is between 17K and 20K.

The 2017 Rock n Roll Marathon Series has a total economic impact of \$19.2M with a direct economic impact on the District of Columbia totaling more than 14.5M. The 2017 Rock n Roll Marathon Series "turn by turn" route includes 10 blocks within the ANC5E - streets within 5E09 and bordering 5E08, 5E07, 5E04, 5E05, and 5E06 are impacted as follows: (1) Runners enter Bryant Street, NW from 2nd Street NW eastbound to North Capitol Street NW; (2) Runners turn south onto North Capitol Street, NW under Rhode Island Avenue and New York Avenue, NW exiting the ANC at New York Avenue, NW; the Marathon Series will have a total impact time of 6:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. including clean-up in ANC 5E;

District Snow Team Readies: Motorists are asked to drive carefully and remove any snow from their vehicles before travelling. As a precaution, property owners should spread an abrasive rock salt, deicer, or non-clumping kitty litter on their sidewalks. Property owners – residential and commercial – are reminded that they are required to remove snow from their sidewalks within the first eight hours of daylight after a snow event ends.

Residents who are homeowners and live in their own homes and are age 65 or older and/or living with a disability may be eligible for an exemption from this requirement. For further information about the exemption process and to receive an application, call 311.

AVOID A SANITATION TICKETS:

Regular Trash Collection: Place trash and recycle containers out for collection no earlier than 6:30 PM on the night before - no later than 6 AM the morning of collection day. Residents are required to remove trash and recycle containers from public space (the alley) by 8 PM on your collection day.

Bulk Trash Collection: Call 311 to set up appointments before placing bulk trash out (7 items) for collection. Place bulk trash out no earlier than 6:30PM the day before and no later than 6 AM on collection day. Place them where the trash and recycle are collected.

Without appointment: Take bulk items to the Fort Totten Transfer Station, 4900 John F. McCormack Drive NE. Other

City Services include abandoned autos, alley cleaning, illegal dumping, parking enforcement, potholes, trees, & street lights. The rep will provide a tracking # of your request.

Yard Cleaning and Grass Cutting: Residents are responsible for the up keep of the area abutting the front and back of their homes. This may include front and back yards, sidewalk and alley abutting your home. Fines may occur from the city if DPW or other agencies have to come out to accommodate this request.
